The application form includes the programme applied for, personal details, address details, parent's details, academic details, entrance exam details, work experience details, certification & achievement details, payment details & declaration by the student.

The University is committed to fair, transparent, and consistent admissions practices. Students are selected based on their individual merits, abilities, and aptitudes. The University aims to increase the diversity of its student population: we believe that diversity is educational as well as socially desirable in a civilized society, enriching the educational experience for all. We therefore seek to attract a wide range of applicants from different social, cultural, and educational backgrounds who can demonstrate the academic ability and the skills required to succeed in their chosen studies.

The admissions office is responsible for ensuring that policies and procedures regarding student selection process and admissions are operated fairly and consistently, and in line with the University's strategic aims and objectives and relevant legislation. Assessments of applicants are made by the faculty member of relevant departments. Admissions staff are provided with regular training on admissions issues and are expected to follow University admissions policies, procedures, and guidance.

ADMISSION SELECTION PROCES

APPLICATION CRITERIA

Online Applications are invited from the eligible students for all the programmes. Transparency in the admission process is ensured by compiling all the data. The list of provisionally selected students is prepared, based on merit and as per the criteria given. The application should be prepared in the form prescribed and complete in all respects. The admission team will ensure that the applications in the prescribed form with the required copies of the certificates are obtained from the students at the time of application expecting the result of the final year.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMMES AS MENTIONED BELOW:

- The candidates who have cleared the higher secondary examination conducted by the Government of Karnataka or equivalent examinations will be eligible for UG degree programmes

In the case of candidates who have passed other examinations, the concerned admission counsellor would obtain clearance from the Registrar of the University about the eligibility of the candidates before confirming their admissions. The admission committee finalizes the selection list as per the direction of the Directorate of College Education.

Doctoral Programmes

INTRODUCTION

This Policy incorporates the comprehensive Admission handbook which can be circulated internally. This handbook aims to bring about sustained enrollment growth consistent with the Institution's vision. For effective implementation of this, the Admission Committee is constituted. The Committee prepares the Prospectus and the Application Forms. The Prospectus includes the curricular highlights, programmes offered, eligibility criteria, admission procedure, and unique features of the Institution/University. The application form includes the programme applied for, personal details, address details, parent's details, academic details, entrance exam details, work experience details, certification & achievement details, payment details & declaration by the student.

This policy is intended to provide an overarching framework for university admissions policies and admission procedures. The University is committed to fair, transparent, and consistent admissions practices. Students are selected based on their individual merits, abilities, and aptitudes. The University aims to increase the diversity of its student population: we believe that diversity is educational as well as socially desirable in a civilized society, enriching the educational experience for all. We therefore seek to attract a wide range of applicants from different social, cultural, and educational backgrounds who can demonstrate the academic ability and the skills required to succeed in their chosen studies.

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

The admissions office is responsible for ensuring that policies and procedures regarding student selection process and admissions are operated fairly and consistently, and in line with the University's strategic aims and objectives and relevant legislation. Assessments of applicants are made by the faculty member of relevant departments. Admissions staff are provided with regular training on admissions issues and are expected to follow University admissions policies, procedures, and guidance.

APPLICATION SCREENING

Each application will be reviewed by trained and qualified staff working to meet selection criteria. Admissions decisions will be made as quickly as possible. Admissions decisions will be communicated to applicants in an appropriate and timely manner.

FRAUD & PLAGARISM

Alliance University will not admit applicants on the strength of information considered to be either fraudulent or plagiarized. The University reserves the right to reject or cancel an application under these circumstances. The University may terminate a student's registration if he/she is found at a later stage to have submitted a fraudulent or plagiarized application to the University. ADMISSION SELECTION PROCES

APPLICATION CRITERIA

Online Applications are invited from the eligible students for all the programmes. Transparency in the admission process is ensured by compiling all the data. The list of provisionally selected students is prepared, based on merit and as per the criteria given. The application should be prepared in the form prescribed and complete in all respects. The admission team will ensure that the applications in the prescribed form with the required copies of the certificates are obtained from the students at the time of application expecting the result of the final year.

Step 2:

Payment of application cost.

Step 3:

Upon payment confirmation, the applicant will receive a notification email acknowledging the payment and successful completion of the application form process.

Step 4:

The applicant will be notified through Admission call letter for the Selection process.

The admission is cancelled if the candidate fails to produce any of the above documents during the time of the Registration.
